Cynthia was known as the "Toy Auntie" because she gave the best gifts, especially to her young nieces and nephews. Usually, Christmas was celebrated in the New England area, but one summer, Cynthia surprised the family: She packed up Christmas gifts and celebrated Christmas in Charleston, SC, in July!

Cynthia had a great sense of humor and many interests. In particular, she enjoyed reading, watching movies, watching tennis, notably Serena Williams, baseball, especially the New York Yankees, and Tweety Bird, the famous Looney Toons character. Perhaps the Tweety Bird character amused her because she, herself, was as unflappable, understatedly sassy and endearing as Tweety Bird.
